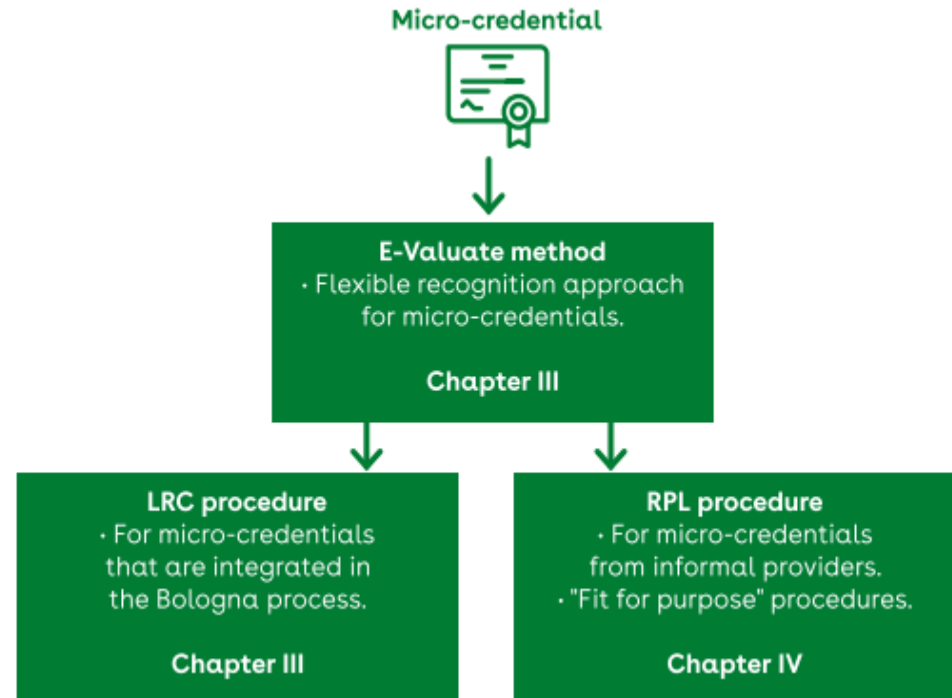

The Micro-Evaluator: a practical recognition tool

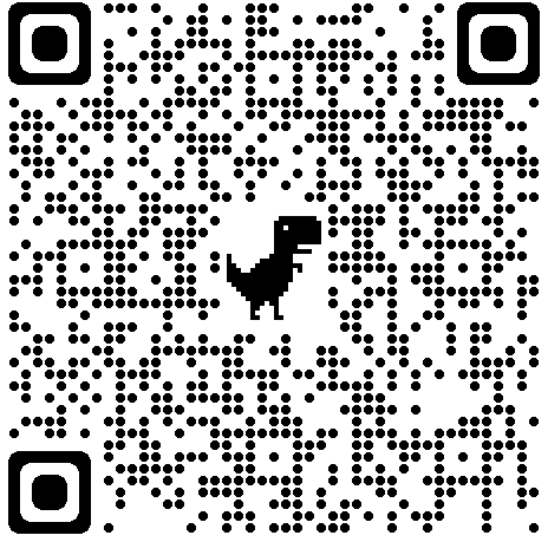
- E-evaluate method
- Recognizing small learning experiences in line with the Lisbon Recognition Convention (LRC)
- Proposes two-track approach

A two-track approach for recognition

1. A procedure in line with the LRC
2. RPL procedure

Traffic light model

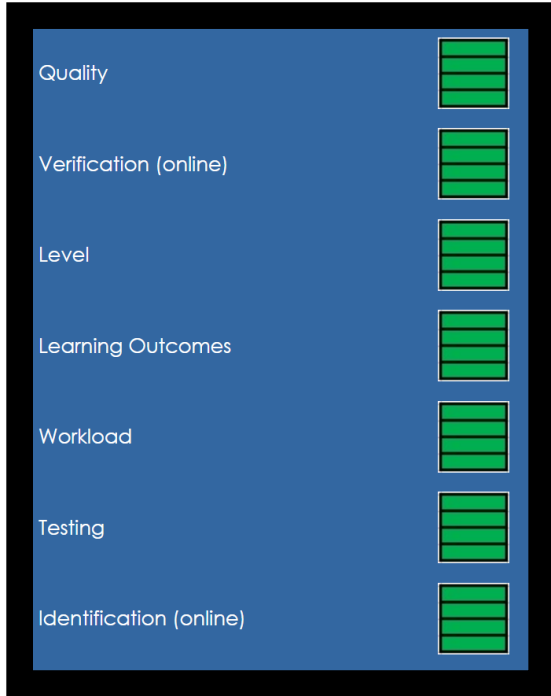
How robust is a criterion?

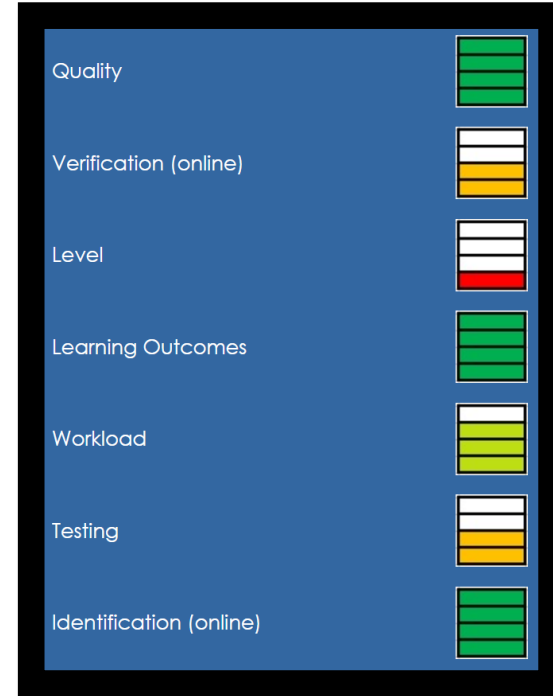

The Micro-Evaluator: possible outcomes



All in green:

- Recognise in line with LRC



Mixed results:

- Prioritise the most relevant criteria
- Consider RPL procedure
